




How WVCHIP Benefited from the Leverage Condition



History of the WVCHIP Program

WVCHIP provides healthcare coverage to children in working families with incomes too high to qualify for Medicaid but who lack access to affordable coverage, specifically children in families with gross incomes up to 300% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), utilizing funding available under Title XXI of the Social Security Act.

WVCHIP was enacted by State Code §5-16b, and was designed to operate with the highest degree of simplicity and governmental efficiency by leveraging existing processes and functions available through other state agencies.




Impact of ACA Requirements

WVCHIP did not use a MSIS reporting system

Required many changes to WVCHIP's enrollment process




Leveraging the WV MMIS Implementation

2015: WVCHIP Leadership, in collaboration with WV Medicaid Leadership, merged 2 projects into 1

Benefits for WVCHIP and Medicaid programs

On January 19, 2016 both programs went live with a new Medicaid Management Information System (MMIS) on the same platform.
