This course also examines EHR use, HIE and other technologies, architectures and infrastructures that will meet the national objectives through the expansion of the National Health Information Network (NHIN), and provider adoption.			1.5 hrs		1.5 hrs
HIT-103: Medicaid and HIT This course equips learners with a better understanding of the federal government's long-term goals for HIT adoption and state Medicaid program expansion. This course examines how the HITECH Act within ARRA encouraged national adoption of HIT.
